Occasionally I'll take a break from writing exclusively about our cruises and take up other topics. This month I want to talk about a nifty navigation app and a companion app that overlays it, that I have been using on cruises and Saturday afternoon jaunts outside the basin. The base app is Garmin Bluechart, which provides very detailed mapping similar to a chart plotter, and the overlay, which "sits" on top of it, is called Active Captain. Both of these are loaded on my iPad. Mine is on a major cellphone network so it picks up triangulation from the cell towers to display the boats position. You can also buy a plug in "dongle" GPS receiver for the iPad if you are not connected to a major cellphone carrier to get positioning. I find that the chart plotting features come pretty close to what I get on my dual chart plotters, which cost in the neighborhood of \$5000. Bluechart costs under \$50 to download. Active Captain is free and is a reference source for navigational aides, bridges, marinas, yacht clubs, and suggested anchorages. It also has data from the universe of users who submit information on navigational hazards, areas of shoaling, ratings of marina facilities, and other pertinent data that may change quickly. All of this is shown by icons that you can select on the Bluechart. To be certain, I am only glossing over what these two apps can do. So if you are further interested in seeing a demonstration, let me know and I'll bring the iPad to a Power Fleet meeting and hook it up to the large screen TV for a demo. Now

you may ask: "Why fool with an iPad when you have two new chart plotters?" Answer: "Old eyes." The chart plotters are at arms length while the iPad can be at nose length if I want. And if the sun is blinding me or the screen, sometimes nose length is the answer. Of course, I do not advocate replacing the chart plotters altogether as they do provide a lot of useful functions such as driving the autopilot to a waypoint and displaying radar and other data.

Now after all this talk about navigation you would think I'm "spot on" all the time. Well...no. My confession is that I managed to have a soft grounding on our trip to Palm Island Marina in September due to a few moments of inattention. If it has never happened to you than you can smile, otherwise share my pain. When we got back, Gracia and I took the boat over to Blenker's Marine across the river. It was there for three days. They had the props repaired and did my bottom sanding/painting, all to my satisfaction, and at a good price. They are an advertiser in our monthly magazine and I would recommend them.

Lastly, the Power Fleet will be on a joint cruise with the Sail Fleet to the St. Petersburg Municipal Marina on December 5th to the 7th. The annual St. Petersburg Boat Show will be on that weekend and I understand that the SPYC Parade of Boats will also be taking place. I'll have more on this cruise as the time approaches. If you want to participate drop me an email. – *Ron*






1st Quarter --- Off to a Good Financial Start

While the fiscal year always starts slowly with an Operating Loss, a quick glance at the chart shows that we're in a much better place this year than the prior three years. This is largely due to better membership retention and great recruiting last year. So we're about \$11,500 and 28 members ahead of where we typically are at the end of the 1st Quarter.





Active Member Participation & Spending

Comparing the 1st Quarter of both years, average use of the Club Food & Beverage is down from 75.6% to 72.6%, while average spending is the same at \$116/member for the same 3-month period. Both a longer shutdown and rainy weather hampered the results. Looking at a longer time span, in 11 out of the last 15 months participation has increased when compared to the comparable month the year before.

Best Value to Members

As most members know, those who use the Club get the greatest value from their dues. Restaurant & Bar Revenue doesn't cover the cost of operating these amenities as is shown on the attached chart. (Note: "COGS" is Cost of food and liquor, "Fixed" is prorated overhead expenses such as electricity, management.)

Just a little lighting can achieve a lot of sparkle in our basin.

Each boat please install at least 100' preferably white lights-sailboats up the mast and down the stays, power boats highest point, whatever is effective for your boat. Look at the impact each boat's efforts did for this marina.

Install the weekend after Thanksgiving November 27-28.
Set timer for on at 6, off at 10.

Lights are available in 50 or 100 foot lengths that should cover stays or outriggers or perimeter of lower profile boats. Check out home improvement stores, Big Lots and even the craft and dollar stores for lighting. Be sure to use appropriate outdoor lights, secure connection to 110 and timer in your boat and observe all safety recommendations. Remember each new pedestal has 110 connections.


